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The Defensible Space Assistance Grant is part of California Climate Investments, a statewide program that puts billions of Cap-and-Trade dollars to work reducing GHG emissions, strengthening the economy, and improving public health and the environment—particularly in disadvantaged communities. 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California Fire Safe Council (CFSC) is pleased to announce that eleven (11) organizations have been selected to receive grant awards for defensible space assistance projects. With funding from a 2022 CAL FIRE master grant, the CFSC will award more than \$5 million to these applicants through the Defensible Space Assistance Grant Program.

The Defensible Space Assistance Program provides funding to organizations to assist vulnerable populations (i.e., low-income, disabled, senior/elderly, disadvantaged), in High and Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zones, with defensible space treatment on their property. Defensible space, coupled with home hardening, is essential to improve a home's chance of surviving a wildfire. Projects will implement a coordinated approach to defensible space compliance with CAL FIRE and other stakeholders, with priority for vulnerable populations.

We look forward to working with the award recipients to enhance each county's wildfire resilience through defensible space efforts, while working toward our shared vision of a more fire-resilient California!
